



1	In several cases in the last year I have seen the City Attorney tasked with developing solutions for community issues that are more extensive than legal advice and beyond the scope of her office. When there are complex community issues, we need to have detailed understanding of what the issues are and broad consideration of what the best ways may be to address them. These may require legal/policy solutions, though may also be broader and require different kinds of solutions or interventions; in many cases, multiple interventions and even community partnerships. When the City Attorney is responsible for solving an issue, that solution is generally going to be legal, and rightfully so, but it may or may not be the most effective solution. It may be an effective part of a solution, but not as effective as it could be if it were part of a broader strategy. Therefore, my concern is not that the City Attorney is doing something improper, but rather that more clear lines of responsibility need to be drawn to ensure the City Attorney and her office aren't being tasked with responsibilities that are beyond their role. In other words, city staff (non-attorney's office) should be doing the legwork of identifying and researching the issues, needs, and potential solutions, and then engage the City Attorney to provide legal advice and work on the legal aspects of these issues – not expecting the City Attorney's office to manage the whole process. In regards to providing options and alternatives, as appropriate, I would like to see this done more extensively, and more creatively. Whether or not the City Attorney believes a policy solution would or would not work in Battle Creek, it should be included and presented as an option for the Commission to consider and debate.	8/23/2017 12:44 AM
